Church Crawl

'Bournville - more than just Chocolate!'

Tuesday 14th October

TOUR ITINERARY (fully-guided & inclusive)

- ➤ Depart Ludlow by coach @ 9am (return approx 6.15pm)
- ➤ First stop: The Romanesque-style Parish Church of St Francis of Assisi (1925), funded by George Cadbury and designed by Alexander Harvey
- ➤ Here we will have a talk/film of Bournville given by Bob Booth, chairman of Bournville Historical Society and archivist of the church. Coffee inc.
- ➤ We then take a short, guided walk across the Village Green, en route passing the 'Rest House' (1913) before arriving at the Carillon Building (another bequest of the Cadbury Family). Here we learn about the fascinating history of the building and the bells (1906)
- ➤ To complete the morning, we visit Selly Manor Museum. This 14thC timber-framed building was saved from demolition in 1907 by the Cadbury family, dismantled, and reassembled on its current site
- ➤ Following lunch (inc in cost), we drive 5 mins to the Serbian Orthodox Church of the Holy Prince Lazar. Again, sponsored by the Cadbury Family, this church built in 1965 in the 14thC Byzantine style, has a truly amazing interior and is rightly described as a Hidden Gem of Birmingham
- > Return to Ludlow @ approximately 6.15pm.
